Reasons	This gives us more control over what happens to our assets in the event that we are ever disaffiliated from the Societies Council or we dissolve (stop operations entirely) as a club. The default rule is that upon disaffiliation from the Societies Council, all our assets would go to the Societies Council, which is not ideal for our assets being used for the work of the Lord (see Societies Councils Rules r 144)
