

Dear Ed,

We, Andrew Lawrance, Sheamus McKerney and Sharon Sriharan motion to make the following changes to the constitution.

Motion 1	
Context	<i>A new section at the end of the constitution</i>
New section	Dissolution 6.10 If upon the dissolution of CU there remains, after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, it must not be paid to, transferred, or distributed amongst the members of CU. It must be given to the AFES, or a club affiliated with the AFES. If any property cannot be given to the AFES or a club affiliated with the AFES, it must be given to a church that wholly agrees with the CU doctrinal basis, or to some charitable body determined by the members of CU at or before the time of dissolution. In default of any such resolution, such payment, transfer, or distribution shall be determined by the AFES. 6.11 If CU disaffiliates from the Societies Council, the Public Affairs Council or any other body of the Guild or other organisation and continues to conduct activities, all property of CU prior to disaffiliation shall remain the property of CU.
Reasons	<i>This gives us more control over what happens to our assets in the event that we are ever disaffiliated from the Societies Council or we dissolve (stop operations entirely) as a club. The default rule is that upon disaffiliation from the Societies Council, all our assets would go to the Societies Council, which is not ideal for our assets being used for the work of the Lord (see Societies Councils Rules r 144)</i>

Motion 2	
Context	<i>In the objects of CU under 'Relations with Other Bodies'</i>
Change from	2.5 To establish and maintain affiliation with at least one council of the Guild of Undergraduates, excepting where such bodies' regulations or by-laws directly contravene the Objects of CU.
Change to	2.5 To become and remain affiliated to the Societies Council and Public Affairs Council, excepting where such bodies' regulations or by-laws directly contravene the Objects of CU.
Reasons	<i>Requirement of the Societies Council Rules r 125(c) and Public Affairs Council Rules r 102(a)</i>

Motion 3	
Context	<i>In the objects of CU under 'Relations with Other Bodies'</i>
New section	<i>Insert at 2.6 and renumber subsequent sections</i> 2.6 To promote cooperation between CU and other Affiliated Societies, the Guild and its Departments and Sub-Councils.
Reasons	<i>Requirement of the Societies Council Rules r 125(c)</i>

Motion 4

Context	<i>In the objects of CU under 'Relations with Other Bodies'</i>
Change from	5.17 The Committee shall appoint a delegate and a deputy delegate to represent CU to each of the councils to which CU is affiliated.
Change to	5.17 Members of the Committee must attend training as required by the Guild or Societies Council Committee, including but not limited to Guild Student Leadership Training.
Reasons	<i>The old 5.17 is no longer required as the system for delegates was removed in the rewrite of the 2023 Societies Council Rules. The requirement to attend training is in Societies Council Rules r 125(p). Instead of having two motions the first to remove 5.17 and the second to insert a different provision in its place, this is one motion to replace the section.</i>

Motion 5

Context	<i>A new section under the elections section of 'Provisions Concerning All General Meetings'</i>
New section	4.7.7 Up to three days after an election, any Normal Member who ran for a position on the Committee at that election may appeal the outcome of the election to the Guild Governance Committee on the grounds that there was an error in the procedure when a vote was conducted or there was a contravention of any applicable rule, regulation, or standing order in respect of the election. If the Governance Committee rules that the election was not conducted in accordance with the applicable rules, regulations, or standing orders, another election must be called. The outcome of an election may only be appealed once.
Reasons	<i>Requirement of the Societies Council Rules rr 125(q) and 134</i>




Context	<i>A new section under the 'Powers and Responsibilities of Committee'</i>
New section	<p><i>Insert at 5.18 and renumber subsequent sections</i></p> <p>5.18 If the Committee reasonably suspects a member, including a member of the Committee may have engaged in Guild Misconduct or a criminal act, the Committee must report the suspected Guild Misconduct, in accordance with applicable Guild policies and the Student Guild Regulations, and must not take disciplinary action against a Financial Member on its own accord.</p> <p>5.18.1. The Committee must immediately refer —</p> <p>5.18.1.1. criminal matters to the police; and</p> <p>5.18.1.2. Guild Misconduct matters to the Guild and the University.</p>
Reasons	<i>Requirement of the Societies Council Rules rr 125(u) and 133</i>

Motion 7

Context	<i>A new section under 'Obligations to Guild'</i>
New section	<p><i>Insert at 6.7 and renumber subsequent sections</i></p> <p>6.7 CU and persons thereunder must take no action which represses any student's implied right to academic freedom and freedom of speech.</p>
Reasons	<i>Requirement of the Societies Council Rules r 125(y)</i>

Motion 8	
<i>Context</i>	<i>A new section under 'General'</i>
New section	<i>Insert at 6.6 and renumber subsequent sections</i> Dispute Resolution 6.6 The dispute resolution procedure in the Societies Council Rules shall govern any dispute between CU and any other party to the extent that those rules apply.
Reasons	<i>Requirement of the Societies Council Rules r 134</i>
